



New Alameda County COVID-19 Cases by date created







As we reach 20 million vaccines administered and COVID-19 case rates and hospitalizations have stabilized, California is looking to move beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy to fully reopening our economy. On June 15, all industries across the state can return to usual operations with common-sense risk reduction measures such as masking and vaccinations.

What triggers our move Beyond the Blueprint?

On June 15, California will fully open its economy if the following **two** criteria are met:

- 1) Equitable vaccine availability: If vaccine supply is sufficient for all Californians aged 16 years or older, who wish to be inoculated.
- Consistently low burden of disease: If hospitalizations are stable and low, and specifically if hospitalizations among fully vaccinated individuals are low.





What happens beyond the Blueprint?

- All sectors listed in the current <u>Blueprint Activities and Business Tiers Chart</u> may return to usual operations, in compliance with statewide agency guidelines and standards such as masking, testing, and testing or vaccination verification requirements for large-scale higher-risk events.
- Schools and institutions of higher education conduct full-time, in person instruction, in compliance with Cal/OSHA emergency temporary standards and public health guidelines.
- Workplaces promote policies that reduce risk, including improved indoor ventilation, and mask-wearing in indoor and other high-risk settings, as well as remote work without impacting business operations, when possible.
- Californians and travelers will be subject to any current CDPH and CDC travel restrictions.

Non-Performance Venues

 - Performers count toward occupancy capacity limit
 - Indoor performers must wear face covering and physical distance
 - Outdoor performers not wearing a face covering must maintain at least 12 feet distance
 - Private events held at non-performance venue must follow Private Venues & Events Guidance








